In the cutting show pen, NRC&CHA presented several very good cuttings. The year started off with the annual Masini Ranch cutting and ended with the Nevada Cutting Spectacular at the Stix Livestock feedlot. In between were two great cuttings held in Winnemucca. The Masini Ranch cutting enjoyed great weather and cattle while Bryson Masini and his crew kept things moving along smoothly. NRC&CHA was proud to be the host for the annual NCHA days cutting for our region. The event featured a large turnout and many positive comments were received. The Summer Cutting was also held in Winnemucca with another good turnout and enthusiastic participants. The year ended with our 14th annual Cutting Spectacular. As in the past several years, this show was held at the Stix feedlot. Deena Edmonston and Dave Stix provided their usual excellent management, great facility, and good cattle. As noted in the President's message, there was a hard fought race for our two year-end saddles which made for an exciting year of competition.

The Cow Horse show pen was also quite busy, beginning with the April show at Rancharrah. This event was followed by the Rancharrah Cow Horse Classic and the year ended with the cow horse show in Eureka, Nevada. The April show was small, but the contestants rode hard for their wins. The Rancharrah Cow Horse show had a great turnout with contestants arriving from several western states. It also featured its annual barbecue for contestants and friends. The Eureka show was small, but the weather was perfect, the cattle were very cooperative, and the contestants enjoyed themselves as well as providing spirited competition. Approved shows included the stock horse show put on at the March Winnemucca Ranch Rodeo, the AQHA show in Susanville, California, the Winnemucca Stock Horse Classic and Derby, and the Elko Stallion Stakes so the cow horse folks had many good opportunities to show their cow ponies.

All in all, the 2016 show year was a good one for both cutters and reined cow horse enthusiasts and NRC&CHA is looking forward to another good year in 2017.
