

UPDATES FROM THE SHOW PEN

2016 started off with a party! Actually, it was our year-end awards banquet held jointly with the Western Nevada Cutting Horse Association at the Silver Legacy in Reno on February 27. We had a great turnout, one of our largest on record. The food was delicious, the awards were impressive, and the raffle prizes were fun for all.

The first show of the season was the Winnemucca Stock Horse Challenge held on March 4 in conjunction with the annual Winnemucca Ranch Hand Rodeo. Cowboys and cowgirls brushed as much winter hair off their horses as they could and showed their skills to judge Bobby Ingersoll. There were 38 entries and an enthusiastic audience cheered them on.

Bobby Ingersoll was present again to put on a youth reined cow horse clinic at Rancharrah on March 19. The clinic was well attended by aspiring reined cow horse riders with able help from Ken and Tracy Arnold and Cindy Cullen. The participants reported that they had a great instructor and all came away with lots of new information.

April 1, 2, and 3 moved us to the cutting pen for the annual Masini cutting at the Masini feedlot in Yerington. The weather cooperated perfectly, considering that we have had snow, rain, wind, sand blasts, and other delights from Mother Nature at past shows. Bryson Masini and crew provided us with good ground and cattle and Scott Martin was our judge.

Corey Cushing held an overflowing reined cow horse clinic at Rancharrah on April 16 and 17. The clinic was eagerly anticipated as there was a waiting list to enter. Corey didn't disappoint with 2 days of hands-on instructing, ensuring that everyone got their money's worth. The evening of April 16 was once again "Dinner and a Movie" with Corey analyzing show runs for everyone, Doug Ingersoll providing a judge's point of view, and Dr. Sadie Miller, DVM, presenting an informative discussion on performance horse pre-purchase exams. Next on the show agenda was the Rancharrah Cow Horse Show, held on April 23. Judge for this event was Paul Barnes from Minden, NV. Mike Mieras and the crew at Rancharrah once again worked very hard to provide us with good ground and excellent help. One of our newest Board members, Leonard Routt, passed away suddenly right before the show. A moment of silence and a tribute to Lenny were held, including a horse running free in the arena.

The Rancharrah Cow Horse Classic and NCHA Days in Winnemucca are coming up soon and there will be more to report next quarter.
